



Santai Ride Seberang: Trailing the Stories of Seberang Perai



This map is made by local riders, for riders. Whether you're cruising solo or riding in a small group, it's your friendly guide to the best-kept secrets of Seberang Perai—hidden food stalls, scenic chill spots, and neighbourhood gems only the locals know about.

These aren't your usual tourist stops. They're places we've stopped at for a quick laksa, taken a quiet break under the trees, or prayed before the next stretch. Our goal is simple: support local, keep it real, and share the charm of our own backyard.

Many of these spots are run by small businesses or families, tucked away in kampungs or residential areas. So ride with heart—keep it quiet, don't litter, and always show respect to the people and places you pass.

Some roads can get a bit narrow or bumpy, and not everything's on Google Maps. Slow down, especially near homes and schools. And since most places don't run on rigid hours, it's smart to call ahead if you're making a special trip.

So gear up, go easy on the throttle, and ride with open eyes and good vibes. There's a lot to explore out there—and it's even better when we ride with care.



How to Use This Map?



We've suggested 3 casual ride routes for day trips, covering Seberang Perai Utara, Tengah, and Selatan. Each route is a mix of food, culture, and nature—perfect for a weekend exploration or a slow weekday cruise.

But don't let the routes limit you! These are just our recommendations. Feel free to customize your own adventure depending on your pace, timing, and interests. Explore at your own rhythm—because sometimes the best rides are the unplanned ones.

Warung Kampung 20, Penaga

1359, P101, 13110 Penaga, Penang

Operating Hours: Monday to Saturday, 9am-4pm

Looking for authentic kampung cooking? This humble roadside warung in Penaga is known for one thing—its creamy, fragrant Gulai Semilang. Made with catfish and coconut milk, it's a Penang northern favourite, bursting with flavour and nostalgia. It's a no-frills, local eatery with wooden tables, a shady roof, and friendly smiles. If you're riding through rural Penaga, this makes a satisfying lunch stop.



Pantai Robina, Butterworth

Pantai Robina, Jalan Pantai Bersih, Kampung Telok Air Tawar, 13050 Butterworth, Penang.

A breezy, scenic beach just outside Butterworth town. Pantai Robina stretches 700m and offers uninterrupted views of Penang Island and the Penang Bridge. It's not ideal for swimming, but perfect for walking, rock fishing, picnicking, or flying kites. Early morning is quiet and peaceful, while the 5–7pm golden hour offers postcard-worthy sunsets. Coconut water, laksa, and local snacks are sold at nearby stalls. For motorcyclists, it's an ideal stop to unwind and watch the waves roll in.

Masjid Daerah Seberang Perai Utara, Butterworth

Jalan Teluk Air Tawar, Telok Air Tawar, 13050 Butterworth, Pulau Pinang

Operating Hours: 5:30am- 10:30pm, daily

Known as Masjid Sejuk or Masjid Hijau, this mosque is a landmark of calm and eco-conscious design. Built in 1998 and opened in 1999, it offers a cool interior even during hot afternoons. Its architecture and leafy surroundings make it a soothing prayer stop. The mosque has shaded parking and clean washrooms, making it a practical, peaceful place for riders to take a break.



Dataran Pemuda Merdeka, Butterworth

Jalan Haji Ahmad Said, Bagan Luar, 12200 Butterworth, Penang, MALAYSIA.

This open green space was once the British Recreation Club field. Today, it's a meaningful local landmark known as Dataran Pemuda Merdeka or Padang Bandaran MPSP. Historically significant for early independence movements, it's now used for family outings, town events, and weekend markets. A quick, easy detour for riders interested in Malaysia's community history.



Butterworth Art Walk

Lorong Bagan Luar 1, Bagan Luar, 12000 Butterworth, Pulau Pinang

Art and history meet at this colourful 400-metre back alley near Jalan Bagan Luar. With over 20 murals painted by local artists, the walk showcases Butterworth's past—from coconut trade to British Malaya shipping. Each artwork tells a story and makes a great photo spot. It's quiet, quick to walk, and a refreshing change from the usual tourist trail. Ideal for creative riders and mural chasers.



Bukit Panchor State Park & Local Laksa Stop
Jalan Taman Bukit Negeri, 14300 Nibong Tebal, Pulau Pinang

On the edge of Penang and Kedah lies Bukit Panchor, Penang's only official state park, offering 446 hectares of lush forest, trails, and cool stream paths. Great for short hikes, jungle air, and birdwatching. Before you enter, pass through Kampung Sungai Buaya, where two roadside stalls serve famous RM2 laksa (once known as "Laksa Seringgit"). Pair it with ais kacang or soup noodles. An ideal detour for riders who like forest trails and authentic food experiences.



Susu Lembu Segar Old Farm Classic, Sungai Bakap

2161, Jln Besar, Sungai Bakap, 14200 Sungai Jawi, Pulau Pinang

Operating hours: 8pm-12 midnight

A cosy stall located in a shoptlot serving fresh cow's milk in original, honey, milo, and sweetened flavours. Popular with locals, especially bikers cruising through South Seberang Perai at night. The milk is smooth, well-pasteurised, and goes perfectly with charcoal toast and soft-boiled eggs. Spacious seating, warm ambience, and open late—it's a great supper stop after dark.

Kacang Poi Utagha, Kepala Batas

Jalan Paya Keladi, Kepala Batas, Malaysia

Operating hours: 7am-12pm, closed Fridays

Hidden inside a plant nursery near a junction, this quiet warung is known for kacang poi, a Middle Eastern-inspired dish made with stewed fava beans and minced meat, served with thick toast. The flavours are bold, and it's a satisfying breakfast if you're out riding early. Other simple options like toast and eggs are also available.



Pasar Bisik, Penaga

*Kampung Kuala Muda, 13110 Penaga, Penang.
Operating hours: 9.00am to 3.00pm daily*

Pasar Bisik means “Whisper Market”—here, buyers whisper their bids to sellers, preserving an old-school auction method. This market at the Kuala Muda fishing jetty bustles with fresh seafood from Penang, Kedah, and Perak. Best visited early when boats arrive. You’ll also find fresh vegetables, snacks, and household items. An exciting stop for riders who enjoy authentic markets and village culture.



Ikan Bawal @ Juru (Warung Kelapa Sawit), Kampung Tok Kangar

Jalan Tok Kangar, 14100 Simpang Ampat, Pulau Pinang

Operating hours: Monday-Saturday, 9.30am - 3.30pm (closed on Sunday)

This roadside stall under palm trees is locally famous for its crispy deep-fried ikan bawal (pomfret) served with rice and sambal. There's no signage, but just ask anyone for "Ikan Bawal Juru under the palm trees"—they'll know. The fish is fresh, the portions are generous, and you can cool off with coconut water or a scoop of ice cream. Rustic, simple, and unforgettable.

Masjid Ar-Rayyan Bandar Cassia

Jalan Batu Kawan, Simpang Ampat, Pulau Pinang

Opened in March 2025, Masjid Ar-Rayyan is a new spiritual landmark in Batu Kawan. Built with RM10 million in public and private funding, it now serves the growing Bandar Cassia community. With space for 2,000 worshippers, spacious parking, and modern facilities (funeral room, nikah room, VIP lounge), it's a comfortable stop for Muslim riders looking to pause, pray, or unwind in peace.



Jeti Batu Musang & Pulau Aman

7C84+79, Simpang Ampat, Penang

This jetty is the launch point to Pulau Aman, just a 10-minute boat ride away. The jetty itself has become a chill hangout for riders—great halal food nearby, fishing activities, and plenty of sea breeze. Pulau Aman is known for its prawn noodles, fresh seafood, kayaking, trekking, and sights like the historic Telaga Emas (1789) and Masjid Ar-Rahman (1817). A hidden island escape perfect for a day trip by motorbike and boat.



Kedai Bakso Medan Mbak Julia, Tasek Gelugor

Kampung Matahari Naik, Jalan Permatang Manggis, 13300 Tasek Gelugor, Pulau Pinang
Operating hours: 11 am–7 pm (closed Sunday)

If you love spicy Indonesian dishes, this kampung eatery is a must. Known for bakso ayam, bakso daging, and fiery sambal, it also serves nasi pecel lele, laksa sotong, and mee kuah. Generous portions and bold flavours make it a favourite among both locals and tourists. A tasty pit stop for a different kind of comfort food.

Selama Beach Campsite

Selama Beach Campsite, Sungai Siputeh, 34140 Rantau Panjang, Perak

Experience old-school camping with modern comforts at Selama Beach Campsite. Each pitch offers electricity, water, and light—no noisy generators, just nature. A deep, clean river winds through the site, perfect for swimming, tubing, and fishing. The peaceful setting is ideal for winding down after a ride, with nature as your backdrop. Loved for its simplicity and natural charm, this campsite is a hidden gem for outdoor enthusiasts looking to reconnect with the earth. Bring your tent or rent a spot and enjoy a quiet evening under the stars with the soothing sounds of flowing water.

Lata Tebing Tinggi Waterfall

34140 Rantau Panjang, Perak

Tucked just 10 minutes from Rantau Panjang, Lata Tebing Tinggi is a well-kept secret waiting to be discovered. This pristine waterfall is surrounded by untouched jungle, crystal-clear cascades, and refreshing pools that offer a cool dip on a hot day. It's the perfect pitstop for nature lovers and riders needing a break. Bask in the serenity, enjoy a picnic, or stay overnight in cozy chalets nearby. The warm hospitality of the surrounding Malay village adds to the charm, making it a rejuvenating experience you won't forget.

Big Clock Roundabout Parit Buntar

93, Jalan Teh Peh Kong, Kampung Permatang Tok Mamat, 34200 Parit Buntar, Perak

Standing tall at the heart of Parit Buntar, this elegant 39-foot clock tower with its golden onion dome is more than a landmark—it's a symbol of community pride. Built in 1959 with public donations and inaugurated in 1961 by Tunku Abdul Rahman, it represents a wave of patriotic architecture after independence. Located where three main roads meet, it's the perfect heritage stop for riders exploring town. Take a moment to admire its Moorish design, read the donor plaque, and feel the spirit of a town built on unity and legacy.

Aki's Gallery

Kampung Chepor, 33400, Lenggong, Perak

Operating Hours: 10am-6pm daily

Step into a living museum of Malay heritage at Aki's Gallery in Kampung Chepor. Set in a traditional 1957 Malay house, this charming gallery showcases over 500 antique treasures—each with a story. Curated by local collector Tok Aki, highlights include a century-old sugarcane press, vintage irons, and classic wedding items. Tok Aki himself often shares tales of Lenggong's cultural and geological past. From the "serambi" to the old-style kitchen, the house is a journey through time. For a deeper experience, arrange a visit with a local GeoGuide. It's a cultural ride worth making.

Sungai Atas Sungai

34510 Redang Panjang, Perak

Witness a rare engineering marvel where one river flows over another! Built in 1936, this aqueduct channels Sungai Ijok above Sungai Redang Panjang, forming a 5-kilometer canal supported by a sturdy bridge still standing today. Walk the structure, marvel at the clear water running above and below, and imagine its role in tin mining and irrigation. Nearby, visit the Telaga Gergasi—a massive 18-meter-deep well from the same era, used to manage water flow to Tasik Bukit Merah. A must-see for curious riders and history buffs exploring the legacy of British-era infrastructure.

Air Terjun Junjung

3, Jln Ayer Puteh, 09000 Kulim, Kedah

Escape into the refreshing embrace of Air Terjun Junjung, a stunning 30-meter waterfall just 14 km from Kulim town. Surrounded by lush forest, its natural pool is perfect for a cool swim, tubing, or a picnic by the falls. The area is well-equipped with camping spots, playgrounds, and food stalls, making it ideal for families and nature lovers alike. Feel the crisp air, hear the soothing rush of water, and enjoy a tranquil break from city life. It's a picturesque stop that rewards every rider with both serenity and scenery.

Base Camp Bukit Awang Sariah & Puncak Bukit Angin

Set in Bandar Baharu, Kedah—just near the Penang border—this scenic trail takes you from Base Camp Bukit Awang Sariah up to the 416 m peak of Puncak Bukit Angin. The 4.7 km roundtrip hike takes 70–90 minutes and rewards you with a panoramic hilltop view worth every step. Along the way, enjoy Malaysia’s largest natural hill spring pool—perfect for a refreshing dip after your climb. With cool mountain air, lush forest, and a quiet atmosphere, this trail is a soul-soothing stop for riders looking to hike, swim, and reconnect with nature in one unforgettable adventure.

The TL House Puncak Bukit Birut

Ride up to The TL House at Puncak Bukit Birut for a stunning hilltop view that stretches all the way to Penang. Just minutes from the Sungai Petani (South) toll and Bertam, this hidden gem near Kampung Pinang Tunggal is perfect for a relaxing break or photo session with loved ones. The paved road to the top offers a short but thrilling ride with sharp bends—motorcyclists, you’ll love it! With spacious parking and peaceful vibes, it’s a scenic detour worth the sweat. Just take it easy on the way down—those palm trees are closer than they look!

Tugu Sampan Tsunami

Kampung Kepala Jalan, 08500 Kota Kuala Muda, Kedah, Malaysia

Visit the Tugu Sampan Tsunami and Tsunami Gallery for a powerful reminder of the 2004 tsunami that struck Malaysia's coast. Built from 26 damaged fishing boats, the memorial honors lives lost and communities affected, especially in Kedah's worst-hit area, Kota Kuala Muda. Beside it, preserved ruins of tsunami-hit homes silently echo the disaster's force. For riders seeking meaningful stops, this site offers both reflection and respect. It's a humbling and moving experience that connects you with the region's resilience and the untamed strength of nature.
